STUDY AND LIVE IN NYC!

Experience queer New York as you visit some of the country's oldest and most significant queer history archives. Tour the site of the Stonewall Riots and stroll down Christopher Street. Explore the queer past as you hold letters written decades ago by LGBTQ people. Read old diary entries, zines, and records of early LGBTQ activist organizations. Explore grassroots efforts to create and maintain queer archives and examine DIY materials and methods queer people used for activism and to document their own lives. Enjoy iconic attractions like the Statue of Liberty, the Empire State Building, and the Roosevelt Island Tram. See miles of the east coast as you travel by train from VA to NY and imagine being a young queer person 60 or 70 years ago traveling to New York City for the first time.
